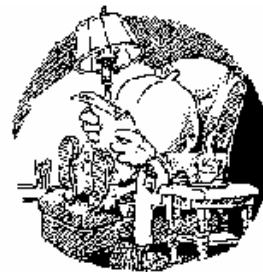

APOCALYPTIC COMEDY. It might be the end of the world again! What do you do? Who do you blame? What do you WEAR? Ashland playwright and comedienne Joanie McGowan answers these and other timely questions during "Rude Awakening", her explosive comedy about waking up in the morning to an End of the World Alert. "Rude Awakening" will be performed Wednesday, August 20th through Sunday, August 24 at the Comedy Sportz Arena, 10th and Oak Streets, downtown Eugene. McGowan plays herself in the show, a 47-year old single woman in a tiny rental apartment, rudely jostled from a lovely dream by an emergency broadcast from Fox McFearlips of the American Spellcasting Network. McFearlips then leads McGowan through a series of Apocalyptic preparations, many of which come directly from the Department of Homeland Security's website, www.ready.gov.

"Rude Awakening" will be performed on August 20th and 21st at 8 PM, August 22nd at 8 and 9:30 PM, August 23rd at 2 PM and 10 PM and August 24th at 2 PM and 8 PM. Tickets are \$8 in advance and \$10 at the door and can be purchased at Tsunami Books, 2585 Willamette, and Star Gate, 1374 Willamette. Information and will call reservations are available at 688-8270. \$2 from the sale of each ticket will be donated to the Lane County Bill of Rights Defense Committee to support their educational efforts throughout the state, and their campaign for a statewide resolution against the Patriot Act, Homeland Security and post 9/11 federal orders which violate our Bill of Rights.

GROWERS CONTROVERSIES

By now, I assume that most of you have seen the display in the co-op about the restaurant expansion proposal. Growers is an organization that tries to involve people in decisions. More important matters warrant a greater effort to make sure people have an opportunity to participate. We have given the co-op coordinators the power to make many less crucial decisions, but everyone should remember that they can't just do whatever

they want. You should hear our Friday discussions about tofu. Controversies swirl periodically through Growers, yet a relatively small number of people attend board meetings. But Growers does not use the form of consensus decision-making whereby people not present at the meeting just lose out. Anyone can come to a future meeting to raise their concerns about something the board has decided. People can also have a spokesperson represent them at a meeting, but communication can then be distorted. Also, consensus works best if people are at the meeting to negotiate on their own behalf. According to my calendar, the next board meeting is Tuesday, August 19th at 7 pm. The board normally meets in the common area upstairs in the Growers Market Building, but might move to the children's area of the co-op. If more people come to the meetings, we can hopefully expand the pool of people who have a good acquaintance with Growers discussions. --Milton Takei
