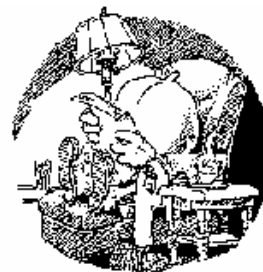

## THE ESSENCE OF GROWERS – By Martin

*“Let's keep being a place where no one and everyone is really in charge, and everyone has a piece of the truth and a chance to say it.”*

As a past board member and past coordinator, I have something to say about who is allowed to say what when and in what context. I also have something to say about who is in charge--in fact, that's where I'll start. Of course, the members are in charge. The members who attend the annual meeting elect the board. The board has the responsibility to talk about policy.

Coordinators are not elected. I became a coordinator (after years doing other responsibilities) pretty much by telling the outgoing coordinator I would take the job. So I was pretty much self-

selected. Two of the current coordinators were officially selected by previous coordinators. Another two coordinators are really acting coordinators, as they haven't been officially selected. I think we have a newer way of officially selecting coordinators, but I don't remember what it is. I'm not sure anyone does.

I'm not saying coordinators don't or shouldn't make decisions. I think the whole point of having a coordinator is having someone to make the decisions that need to be made in an instant (that and having someone who can absolutely be depended on to show up and do whatever tasks must be done to make the co-op happen). I think that's enough. There seemed to be a trend for a while for coordinators, particularly for one past coordinator, to identify the coordinators as a policy-making body in charge of the co-op. This never made sense to me. Since all power in Growers originates in the members, and the members did not elect coordinators to make policy, than the coordinators can not have the power to make policy.

Another trend (again, this mainly happened with one past coordinator) was for the people who happen to be present at some particular time of day to make policy decisions themselves. The perspective of those who did this seemed to be, We're doing the work here, we're the workers, so we are the co-op so this decision is up to us. I have three issues with this perspective: 1. No 2 or 5 or 10 people are the co-op, no matter how hard they work. 2. No shift has a monopoly on hard-working members (I used to work as hard as anyone, but was left out of many of these decisions). 3. Sometimes a lot of time was spent talking while necessary tasks were not getting done.

If some group is to be in charge of setting policy for the co-op, I think that group would have to

be elected by the members. I don't think that group should be just coordinators, because coordinators are busy enough, and because people besides coordinators have important perspectives to offer. In the absence of an elected co-op specific group, I am most comfortable with having the only elected group--the board—set policy for the co-op. I used to get yelled at during dysfunctional coordinator “meetings” for expressing these views. I hope I am not going to be punished for my opinions now.

I'm not trying to argue that anyone should not be part of any decision-making process. By tradition, the board is supposed to listen to people who show up at meetings, and even to give them the equivalent of a vote. I'm arguing that decision-making should include the most people possible, or at least the representatives of the most people.

I think that one reason we get so heated up when we talk about Growers issues is that \*what\* Growers is, and what Growers represents, is very important to us. The essence is as much an issue as the substance is. A philosopher named Thomas Dewey once defined democracy as endless discussion (or debate) about the true definition of democracy. In that vein, I think that the essence of Growers is the freedom to discuss what the essence of Growers is.

I think that the freedom to discuss what is needed to maintain Growers to maintain that essence is as essential. Let's keep talking and disagreeing. Let's keep being a place where no one and everyone is really in charge, and everyone has a piece of the truth and a chance to say it.
