

WE DIDN'T RAISE PRICES, WE FLIPPED THE STRUCTURE

With an amazing show of time, energy and people power over the past few days, we accomplished the changing of the pricing structure to more currently reflect what running the food buying cooperative costs all of us.

Prices used to show a shopper's cost WITH work credit. As of this week, prices show a shopper's cost WITHOUT work credit. In other words, prices on the shelf and on the produce list reflect the food co-op's costs WITHOUT the huge amassing of volunteer work efforts which make this glorious happening occur each week. The 15% work credit will be subtracted from our totals at the cash register, instead of added. Thank you for your patience while we refine this system, and a huge thank you to all those who helped and are helping.

MOST DIFFICULT TIMES FOR WORK CREDIT:

Thursday afternoons from 2 until 3 or 4, depending on the day. Also, if you have a particular talent, idea or peeve, please see a coordinator for setting up a special project.

EASIEST TIMES FOR WORK CREDIT:

Tuesday afternoons and evenings; 4:30 – 7:00pm
Thursday mornings until 2
Thursday evenings until 9-ish
Friday afternoon into evening

THOUGHTS ON INSTITUTIONAL MEMORY

I have become concerned about a loss of Growers institutional memory. People remember things as a result of doing work in the co-op, or participating in groups that rent space in the building. They also can remember things because they attended Growers meetings. For example, I recall someone saying in a meeting that an inspector once warned us that the co-op was looking more and more like a store, and that the government might someday require it to satisfy all the code requirements for a store. HEALTH BENEFITS FAIRS

Many Lane County residents are afraid to go to the doctor because of the high cost of health care. PeaceHealth's free Health Benefits Fairs, held in conjunction with National Cover the Uninsured Week, can help relieve many of those residents' fears. Trained financial counselors, including Spanish-speaking counselors, will meet with individuals interested in applying for the Oregon Health Plan (OHP), Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), PeaceHealth's Bridge Assistance Program, and other state and private assistance programs. Attendees are asked to bring proof of income for the past four months if
