## SPRING HERBAL APPRENTICESHIPS

GivingTree Farm Herb Company still has room for students in our 2006 Spring Herbal Apprenticeship Program. The 150 hour course begins Sunday, April 2nd and continues through Wednesday, June 7th. We will meet for all day Sunday Field trips and from 6 - 9 pm Tuesday and Wednesday nights for lectures. Our last field trip together will be June 4th - 5th, Saturday-through-Sunday; an overnight camping trip. This introductory -to - intermediate course will cover the basic anatomy and physiology of six systems, and accompanying materia medica (= medicinal uses) of related plants, the majority of them local, native species. We will teach you plant ID skills, how to ethically gather your own herbal medicines, plus so much more!

The cost of the Apprenticeship is \$400 dollars. Because we recognize that access to education is important, we offer payment plans, plus a limited number of partial work trades; please contact us for more details. A \$50 - \$100 deposit, due by March 24th, is required to hold your place in the class. Please make all forms of payment payable to: *Lawrence Birch*.

*Please note:* Interested students who wish to omit the Sunday field trips and Tuesday lectures, are welcome to take just the Wednesday night lecture series. The cost for the lectures only, 30 hours, is \$150, (payable by 3/24)
