

But we like to say that the food co-op owns the building, and if you look around at the people attending the annual meeting, you'll see why. A key part of the mission of Growers Market, Inc. is to provide cheap food. Perhaps Growers folks are so accustomed to the current arrangement that they can't imagine that the circumstances could have been different. In fact, the building could have been owned by someone who might wish to replace the co-op with tenants that brought in more money. As things stand, the co-op has protection from the normal operation of capitalist ownership.

## REGISTER AREA DESIGN
