

POST CARBON EUGENE'S 2008 PEAK OIL PUBLIC FORUM SERIES PRESENTS:

"The Climate Change/Peak Oil Crisis and the Human Story: What Role Compassion?"

A presentation and facilitated discussion with Tim Hicks, University of Oregon Law School's Director of the Graduate Program in Conflict and Dispute Resolution.

If a child, on learning about human-caused climate change, asked, "Why did this happen? Why did we do this?", how would you answer? What story would you tell to explain this unprecedented event in human and planetary history, this profound and species-altering change in circumstances that marks a watershed shift in our relationship with our natural habitat, this phenomenon almost too big to grasp? And what message would you give to the child about themselves and the community of humans of which they are a part? With the imminent peaking of our world oil supply, we also face a similar, but equally far-reaching and unavoidable change to our comfort and security. How do we grapple with the needs of Relocalizing all parts of our previously globalized supply-side economy?

At the threshold of our awareness of human-caused climate change and imminent peak oil, at the threshold of the life-impacting consequences of climate change and peak oil, at the threshold of our responses to these crises, what story shall we tell and what difference will it make?

June 1st 2008 GBOD Meeting Minutes

Minutes/Agreements Update (tabled)

It seems like more than one person should read the minutes to weed out major consensed on proposals. Did the minutes from last year get consensed on?

Meeting frequency: We will have one meeting in July for an 1½ hour w/ a break return for a specific amount of time if we need to; one meeting at the beginning of August; these two meetings can be two hours and we will be prepared to go a little longer if we need it; at the August meeting we will decide if we want to continue meeting once a month. We will ask Edward if he can send his building report electronically a couple days before the meeting. CONSENSED

Mural: The visioning committee will take on the job of discussing potentially revamping the mural and if so, the maintenance committee will take on the job of doing it. CONSENSED

Rent increase: It has been awhile since the rent has been raised. Brown and Associates creates reports on market rates for rent in our area, and we direct the finance committee to use these reports as well as other resources to determine a fair scheme for how rents are determined in our building. CONSENSED

Conflict of interest document (tabled)

There were mixed opinions about drafting a conflict of interest document. We CONSENSED to let Doug draft a conflict of interest document.

The New Forum: We CONSENSE to limit the forum to the board members only, all users must be registered; we will discuss at a future meeting if we want to it to be more transparent; and we will stop using google groups (but not get rid of it).

Sam's concern: As a result, the forum will be hierarchical and support secrecy.

Website: We CONSENSE that Sam will talk to Marc Barber about transferring growersmarket.net and the Visioning Committee will decide what to do with it if anything.

Bees: The dry-rot inspector told Phil that he knows

somebody that can get the bees out without killing them. This topic was moved to the Maintenance Committee. CONSENSED

Safe Meeting Policy Revisited (tabled)
