For a green/eco bike tour in Far West Neighborhood Saturday, July 18, Meeting at 11 AM at the *Intersection Repair* at Garfield and 22nd. We will find out what neighbors in Far West are doing to make much better use of their properties to take care of their needs and to reduce their ecological footprints. Note -- Far West Neighborhood is centered on 18th and Garfield, two miles + southwest of downtown.

The tour will visit properties in Far West Neighborhood with notable planet and community friendly characteristics such as grass to garden, passive and active solar features, rain water catchment, chickens, bike friendly lifestyle, reclaiming automobile space, cooperation between neighbors and more.

Saturday's bike tour is the first of a series of tours all over Eugene

this summer. The next tour will be Saturday, July 25 in River Road, meeting at 11 AM at Rosetta Park, Evergreen and Benjamin, 3 blocks northwest of River Road and Horn Lane. See www.suburbanpermaculture.org for more on this.

The bike tours are being coordinated by the Neighborhood Leaders Council Committee on Sustainability. A committee with members from 12 of Eugene's neighborhood associations.
