

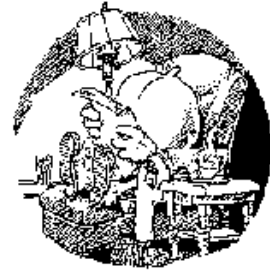

## MEET WALAMA RESTORATION PROJECT

Walama Restoration Project (WRP) is invested in the long-term stability of the native habitats it works to restore and rehabilitate. Therefore, WRP programs and projects involve many others and aim to inspire and educate, particularly youth, about the importance of environmental stewardship. In fact, rooted in its mission is WRP's dedication to environmental stewardship and biological diversity through education and habitat restoration.

In project sites all over Lane County, WRP's field technicians utilize innovative, chemical-free techniques and sustainable partnerships with public agencies to establish and maintain native prairie habitats. They weed invasive vegetation, survey imperiled plant populations, and install and maintain native plant

communities. WRP's education programs have worked with over 10,000 students in over 20 schools and youth organizations to date, engaging them in active, hands-on habitat restoration projects in their public natural spaces. The From Seed to Habitat program involves Lane County students grades 3-12 in the entire plant life process, from seed cleaning to germination and planting.
